

Sharing the Gospel

Three Circles

If you have got this far in our Take a Step Initiative, you will know why you should be sharing the gospel, who you can share the gospel with, and you will be connecting with people by smiling, offering prayer, or sharing your testimony.

This is all leading to an expectation that God will give you the opportunity to share the good news about Jesus.

Many Christians are looking for help to share the good news of Jesus in a simple, relevant, and biblical way. Introducing a tool called: *The Three Circles* - it can be used every time the Holy Spirit prompts you to speak about Jesus, so that you are equipped to share the gospel and lead someone to Christ.

Paul said that he serves Jesus with his whole heart in preaching the gospel, so we should be giving everything for the ministry of the gospel into people's lives. Jesus sends us out into the harvest to proclaim good news, and he expects us to be fruitful. However, there will not be much of a harvest if we are not sowing many seeds of the gospel!




Draw out the three circles a few times, then practise on a friend. Pray and look for an opportunity to share the three circles with someone this week!
